

## Application for Provider Access

### Introduction:

This document sets out Beaumont College's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students for the purpose of giving them information about external education or training offers. This complies with the college's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

### Student Entitlement:

Depending on individual cognition, Outcomes and Aims of Placement, students are entitled to:

- find out about educational qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available in preparation for transition
- hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, taught sessions/workshops, group discussions, promotional material and taster events
- understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

#### b) Opportunities for Access
